## IF GIÒ PONTI WAS KOSOVAR? October 16<sup>th</sup> | 4-4.45- P.M.

#### Abstract

"Love the Architecture! for what it's fantastic, adventurous and solemn created - invented - with its abstract allusive and figurative forms. Forms that enchant our spirit and enrapture our thoughts". In this way Gio' Ponti begins the small paperback book in 1957. He was an architect, designer and writer part of the Italian Rationalist Movement and the Modern Movement. The principles of rational, functional and international architecture, were interpreted in Eastern Europe until the 90s by many Yugoslav architects from Albania, Croatia, Serbia, Montenegro and Kosovo.

During the Prishtina Common Ground Summer Festival in 2014 with the Walkscapes # 02. "Which modern architecture?" We did a tour from Dardania neighborhood, to Center of Youth and Sport and NewBorn monument, the Campus with the Faculty of Law and the Tower of television. Accompanied by Ilir Murseli and Rozafa Basha, with historians, architects, cultural activists and Government Officials, they allowed us to discover the legacy of modern Yugoslav architecture. The city's architectonic history following 1945 is a huge question mark. No one knows who are the architects authors of the buildings, nor the construction dates. There is no public Archive or Land Registry with the original drawings and pictures of the project buildings, that show the differences with the many superfetations. What are the reasons for this amnesia of contemporary architecture? Why erase the past? Why do not remember the architects of the contemporary and modern movement of Kosovo?
