Introduction

This 2-days and half intensive program brings together SoHoLab project partners as well as relevant guest speakers from academia, institutions and civil society (reflecting the structure of SoHoLab national partnerships). A part from representing a fundamental step in project's updating and organisation among national coordinators (24th morning and 25th afternoon sessions), the meeting represents the chance to explore Milanese context through "SoHoLab lens" and to expand a common reflection on core issues addressed by the project. The meeting will focus on offering an overview of the Milanese context in terms of policies and practices related to a "LivingLab approaches" in urban regeneration (25th afternoon), involving experts from different field, backgrounds and social sphere; it will also introduce international project partners to the Milanese case study: San Siro neighbourhood (25th morning). Reflecting SoHoLab approach both moments of theoretical and critical reflection as well as "on field" activities are included in the program.

SoHoLab project

The SoHoLab project (2017 – 2020) establishes and evaluates LivingLab approaches to understand how under-privileged residents, housing associations and other intermediaries can be effectively involved in the regeneration of large-scale social housing estates. Through action-research methodologies, it aims to develop approaches and best practices to address the social-spatial exclusion of residents in deprived large-scale social housing estates in Europe. In particular, it addresses (1) the socially innovative potential of involving social housing residents in the collective regeneration of their housing environment, (2) collaborative research as a tool to gather in-depth knowledge of local living conditions and to contribute to the construction of a counterhegemonic image of the neighbourhoods considered and (3) the capacity of co-productive planning, bonding and bridging efforts to unite residents, neighbourhood inhabitants, public housing organizations, spatial practitioners and cultural, educational and social organizations around shared goals and interests.

SoHoLab approach is based on an international and interdisciplinary partnership between researchers, non-profit organisations, architects, housing professionals and city partners. The approach is being developed, tested and refined on the basis of a retrospective evaluation of existing projects in Paris, of action research in an ongoing LivingLab experience in Milan and new LivingLabs in Brussels and Paris.

Started in June 2017, SoHoLab project has been financed within the JPI - URBAN EUROPE CALL 2016-ERA NET COFUND SMART URBAN FUTURE.
